




Our Mission

31 WISE WOMEN OF NKU

Honoring women on NKU's campus who have made a positive impact on campus and beyond.

SHARLENE BOLTZ

Professor of Law, Chase College of Law

Sharlene, a graduate of Brown University and the University of Michigan, has dedicated 26 years of service to NKU at the Salmon P. Chase College of Law. She teaches courses in commercial law, domestic violence, human trafficking and sexual assault. She also volunteers as a hospital runner for the Women's Crisis Center, which services survivors of gender-based violence, and she currently serves as the board president for the Ohio Alliance for Ending Sexual Assault. Sharlene is the co-founder of RIGHTS (Response Initiative to Guide Human Trafficking Services), a program created to help combat human trafficking. There will be a public open house to learn more about RIGHTS on March 21 at 7 p.m. in Griffin Hall.

"Women's History Month is about stepping into our own roles," she says. "You don't get to define how I use the gifts and talents I can have."
