Public Policy Priorities

HOUSE BILL 321, "ERIN'S LAW"

Require Age-Appropriate Instruction on Sexual Abuse & Violence Sponsors: Representative Scott Lipps, Representative Brigid Kelly

Over 42 million child sexual abuse survivors live in the United States, three million of which are still minors. One in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys experiences sexual abuse before they turn 18, and only one-third of those children disclose. Perpetrators are able to facilitate abuse because our culture keeps so many of us in the dark about what symptoms sexual abuse produces in children. Approximately 90 percent of children who are sexually abused know their abuser, and 60 percent of those children are abused by someone their family trusts. An additional 30 percent of child victims are abused by a family member. The likelihood that a child who has been sexually abused knows, trusts, or is related to his or her abuser discourages the child from telling anyone about the abuse, often increasing the severity, frequency, and duration of the abuse.

HB 321 would require school districts, community schools, and STEM schools to provide annual, age-appropriate instruction on child sexual abuse for students in kindergarten through sixth grade, and age-appropriate instruction on sexual violence for students in grades seven through twelve. The law would also require the Ohio Department of Education to offer free curricula on these topics on its website, as well as require schools to train employees and provide counseling and resources for student survivors.

HOUSE BILL 290

Revoke Professional License for Criminal Misconduct Sponsors: Representatives Boggs & Crawley

Prosecutors lack discretion to charge many licensed providers with Gross Sexual Imposition violations. Instead, they may charge such offenders with Sexual Imposition, which carries a much lighter penalty. This bill seeks to prevent future charging difficulties in cases similar to that of Dr. Ryan Smith, who received 60 weekends in jail plus probation for 66 counts of 2907.06 Sexual Imposition against 22 victims ranging in age from 14 to 74.

Public Policy Priorities

HOUSE BILL 290 (BOGGS, GALONSKI) SENATE BILL 162 (O'BRIEN, ANTONIO)

Removes Limits on Prosecuting & Proving Certain Sex Offenses

This bill would eliminate spousal exemptions from Rape, Sexual Battery, Unlawful Sexual Conduct with a Minor, Gross Sexual Imposition, and Importuning, as well as remove the statute of limitations for 2907.02 Rape.

HOUSE BILL 337 (GALONSKI, STEIN)

Provides Privileged Communications for Victim Advocacy Services SENATE BILL 196 (EKLUND)

Regards Managing Information Related to Sex Crimes

Current law does not protect communications between survivors of sexual violence, human trafficking, stalking, or domestic violence and advocates providing crisis services. Ohio is one of just 14 states without privileged communications in these circumstances. This bill also clarifies mandatory reporting obligations for child abuse in the provision of crisis services, and creates an exemption from the felony reporting statute for advocates serving these survivors, as is customary in the Ohio Revised Code for privilege holders.
