


By many measures, African Americans are more religious than whites and Latinos


"It takes a village to raise a child" is an Igbo and Yoruba proverb that exists in many different African languages. It means that the entire community of people must interact with children for those children to experience and grow in a safe and healthy environment. It reflects the emphasis African cultures place on family and community.

This proverb is so widely used in Africa that there are equivalent statements in most African languages, including "One knee does not bring up a child" in Sukuma and "One hand does not nurse a child" in Swahili
